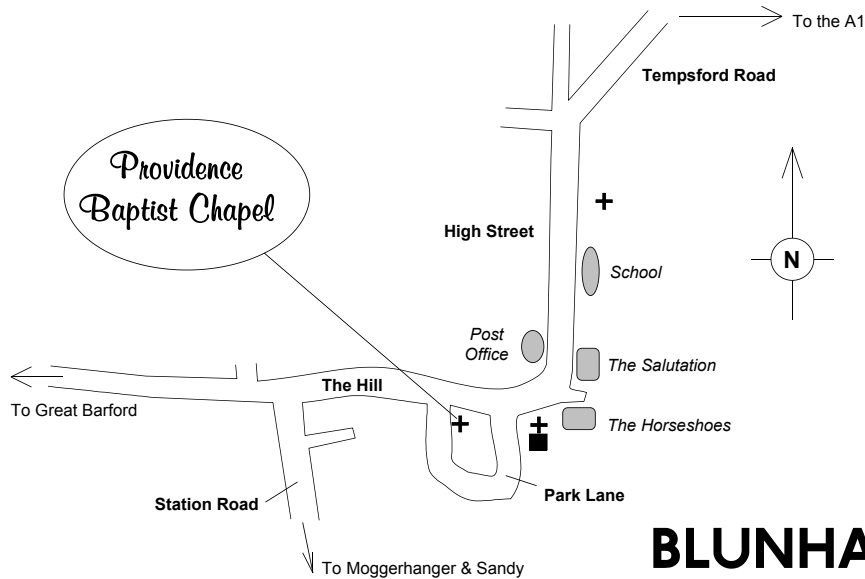

## History of the Chapel

Services have been held in Providence Chapel since it was opened in the year 1842, that's 164 years ago. Following the example of the first Christian Churches, we meet together every Sunday morning and evening and most Friday evenings throughout the year, for the preaching of the Gospel, the good news of Jesus Christ.

You probably wonder why the Chapel stands right on the edge of the road. Well, the reason is that before it was built, the ground that it stands on was part of the garden of the house that stands on the Park Lane / High Street corner, which belonged to a Mr Judd, who gave the land for the Chapel to be built.

In those days there was no need for a car park as people walked to chapel sometimes several miles, not like we do today where we seem to use our cars every day. In the 1960s, the chapel purchased the land where the car park is today. At that time there was a row of cottages that stood there, these were demolished to make it as it is today.

There have been many changes over the years. Many people have passed through the doors, who are no longer with us, but our concern is still the same today, it is to spread the Gospel throughout the area and to share the Good News that "Christ Jesus came into the world to save Sinners". We extend a welcome to you all to come to any of the services. We are able to pick you up if you would like to come but are unable to get there on your own, just phone the number on the back page of this leaflet.

This year we have started a Sunday School before the morning service. This runs between 9 o'clock until 10 o'clock, and is open to all children who are 5 years old or over. Again, if you would like your child / children to come we are able to pick them up, or if you would like to see the Sunday School in action, just come down any Sunday at 9 am. All those involved with this work, have been approved by the Criminal Records Bureau.
